However, there are other children who do not own dictionaries. The teacher always advises them to tell their parents to buy one for them. A <sup>7</sup> dictionary costs around 50,000/=. One can access them at any bookshop in the city and other towns.

Guruwe: No, she wasn't in a very critical condition.

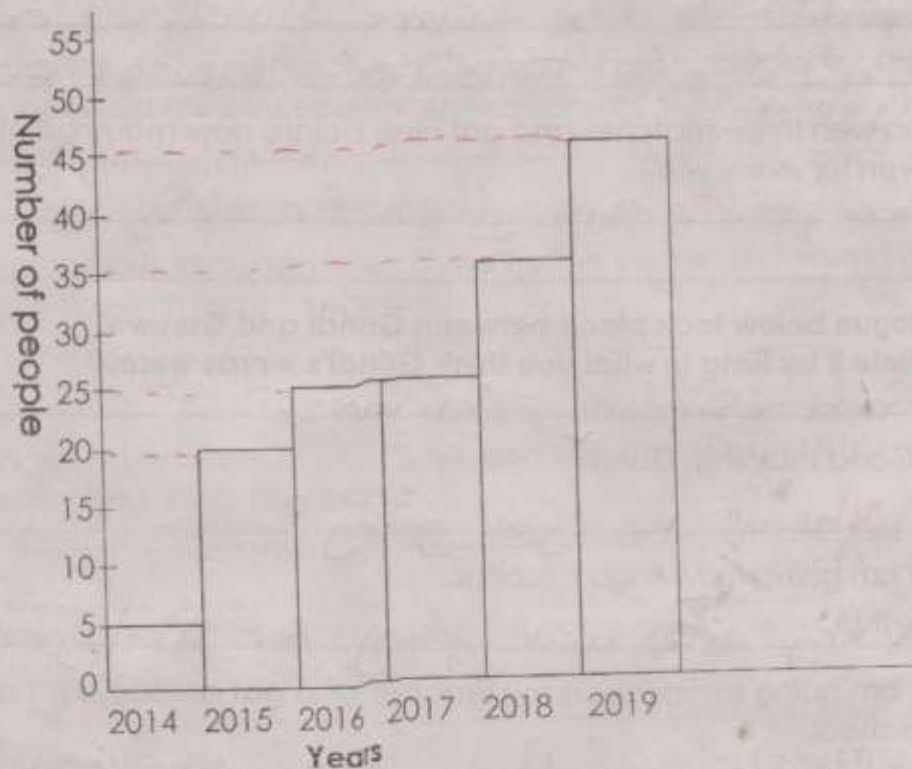
Gundi: How was she taken to the hospital?
